HOOFPRINTS

BY DR. DAVE

I hope this article finds everyone enjoying the New Year. As I stated from the start this is a question and answer forum. Having not had a lot of response thus far, I will answer some of the most asked questions:

What is the best hoof dressing to use on my horse hooves?

Answer: There are many good hoof products on the market today. All are much better than what most of my friends use, WHICH IS NOTHING!!! Oils with a smaller molecular make up are better than those with a larger one. Having said that, vegetable and nut based oils have the smallest molecular compounds in them. Petroleum based products have the largest. Animal fat based products are in the middle. As you can guess, the smaller molecule products are more expensive and the larger less expensive. Depending on your budget, I recommend either making your own hoof dressing by mixing a few oils from both ends of the scale or finding a premade product you think suits your horse and its living conditions. Keep in mind the best hoof dressing I've ever seen is one that actually gets USED!!!

Another very often asked question is;

What kind of supplement is best?

Answer: Once again there are many on the market. The facts are this – A horse needs at least 20mg of biotin with methyomine to be effective. Like other supplements you must have enough to do the job and an over indulgence only finds its way to the much bucket. Having said all this read the labels and use common sense.



